






Digital Badges are online microcredentials designed to be an effective pathway into a career in asset management.

Course Format

IPWEA NZ Digital Badges are entirely online, including videos, live Q&A's, access to discussions groups and access to optional online chat with other course participants. The badges are designed to take 2-4 hours, with progress saved so you can come back to them anytime.

AM101 - Introduction to Asset Management (available March, April and May)

In line with the IIMM framework and AM Basics handbook, this course introduces asset management principles and key concepts, giving a solid foundation of knowledge about what Asset Management is and why we practice it.


2020 LDEG Forum - 19-20 March, Palmerston North Theme: Land Development - A provincial story


