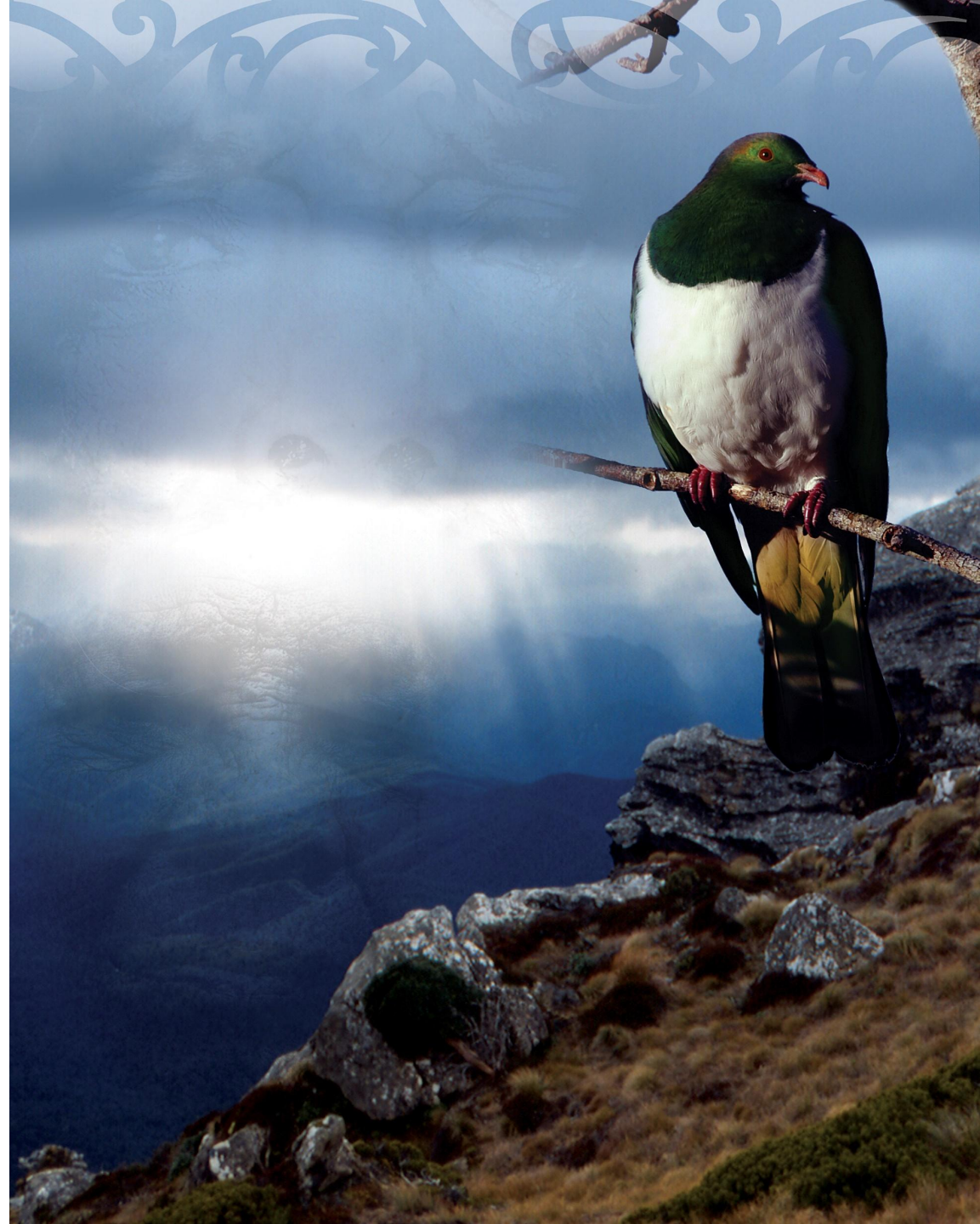

- Āpiti Hono Tātai Hono

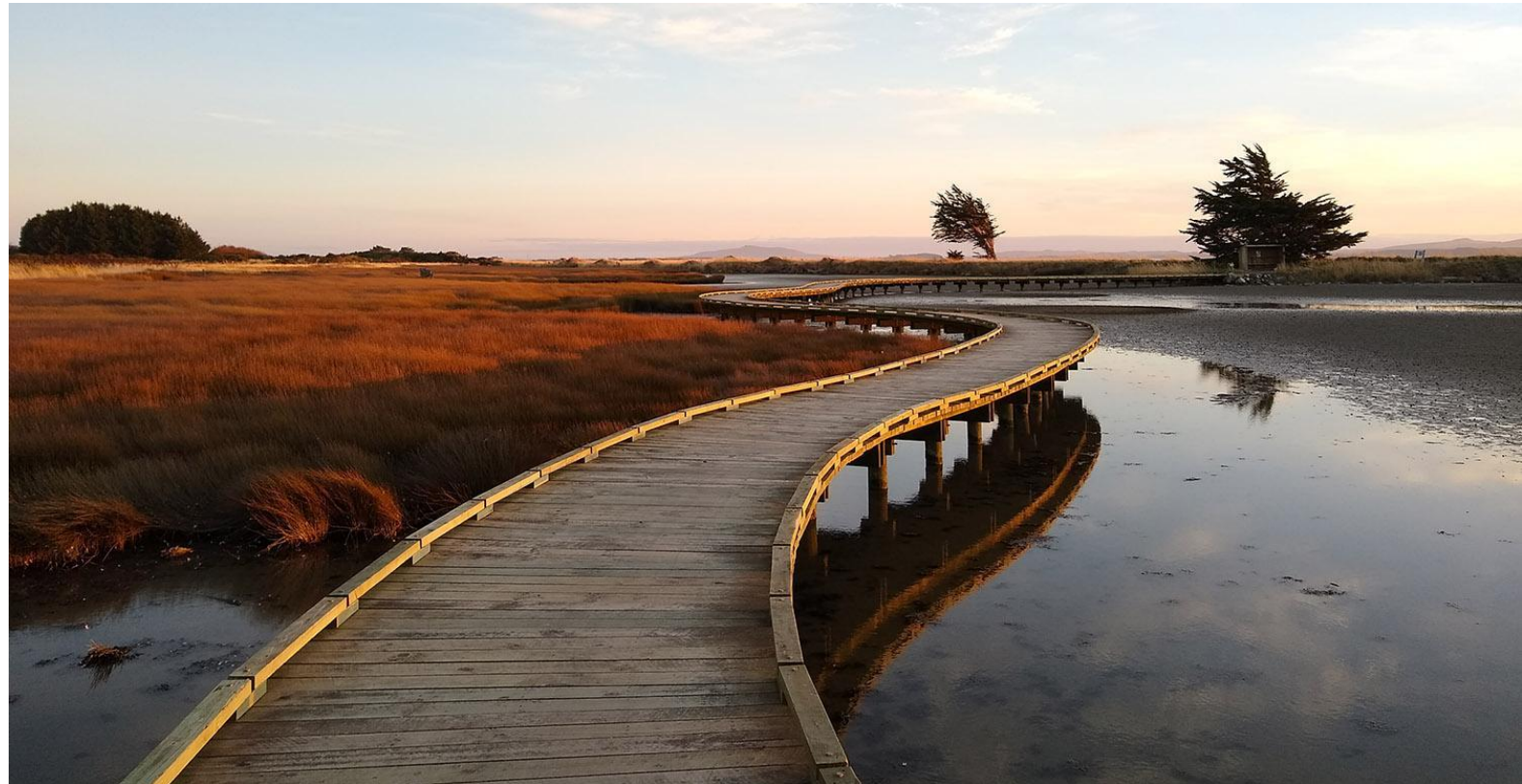
