


History and Background

- NZS3910 most commonly used construction contract in NZ
- Standard form containing general conditions of contract
 - Allocates risk fairly
 - Document contracts quickly and easily
 - Widely accepted and understood
- Last reviewed and updated in 2013
- Scoping workshop in 2020
- Construction sector survey on scope in 2021



Process

- Establish review committee based on identified stakeholders
- Development phase
 - 2022-2023 review and update by the committee
 - Release of Special Conditions in September 2022
- Public consultation
 - May 2023
 - 2,274 comments received
 - Consideration of comments
 - Final approval through Committee ballot then Standards New Zealand Board approval






Key Changes

- Contract Price options
- Role of Engineer to Contract
 - Dual role of Principal's representative and fair and impartial decision maker
 - Could delegate powers to Engineer's Representative
- Replaced with Contract Administrator (instructs) and Independent Certifier (decides)
- Instruction and Decision Review Process
 - Initiated by either party for instruction or decision (other than final) review by Independent Certifier
- Emphasis in the contract for dispute resolution by the parties



Key Changes

- Programme
 - Clarification around what is required for programme updates
- Extensions of Time
 - Two stage process notice of the circumstances within 20
 WD and then notice of details
 - Encouraging discussion and agreement between Contractor and CA
 - IC decision to consider critical path, reasonable steps to mitigate
- Interim and Final Account process allowing Contractor to amend Contract Price after PC to include subsequent Variations or Instructions







Key Changes

- Contractor obligations
 - Design responsibilities can be more explicitly identified
 - Management plans and report requirements have been expanded
 - Specific focus on protection of the environment
- Plain language update
- Terminology updated (e.g Preliminary & General and Margin)
- Option to limit contractor liability
- Format





Land Development Engineer's role

- No formal role in the contract
- Need to work with developer's representative

Consideration of roles when developer constructing on behalf of

Council (such as through PDA)

- Clear lines of communication
- Documentation
- H&S is everyone's responsibility!
